

Jaipur: A few people including a photo journalist sustained minor injuries as the black balloons filled with gas caught fire on Thursday outside the BJP head office. The BJP Yuva Morcha (BJYM) members were observing a Black Day on the completion of two years of Chief Minister of Rajasthan Ashok Gehlot government in the state.

They set an effigy on fire when the black balloons also caught fire and burst. The Morcha

JODH MINES DEPT STAFF IN ACB NET FOR TAKING BRIBE

Jaipur: An engineer and a junior assistant of the mines department of Rajasthan were arrested by the state Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) on Thursday for allegedly accepting a bribe of Rs 20,000 from a farmer, officials said. Assistant mines engineer Chhagan Lal and junior assistant Hari Niwas, who were posted in Sri Ganganagar district, had demanded the money from the farmer, Jarnel Singh, to issue a permit for the removal of gypsum from his land, an ACB official said. On the basis of a complaint lodged by Singh, a team of the ACB trapped the accused.

SARAS MILK TO COST RS 2 LESS PER LITER

Jaipur: The Jaipur dairy administration has reduced the prices of Saras milk. Except Saras standard milk, a reduction of Rs 2 per liter has been made on all packs that will be applicable from Friday evening. 1 liter pack of Saras Gold milk will now be available for 52 rupees, Saras Smart Milk for Rs 36, Saras toned fresh milk for Rs 42. The corresponding reduction in the pack of half a liter has also been done. The 6 liter pack of Saras toned milk will cost 1 rupee less.

2 YEARS OF GEHLOT GOVT

## 'Cong govt failed on all fronts'

Jaipur: The opposition BJP on Thursday hit out at the Ashok Gehlot led Congress government in the state saying it has failed on all fronts and betrayed people of the state in the last two years of its rule.

On the second anniversary of the Congress government, BJP state president Satish Poonia and Union minister Gajendra Singh Shekhawat said that anti-incumbency has developed against the government in two years and it will hit wicket by its own deeds.

Shekhawat said that congratulations to the "Hotel Government" of Rajasthan on completion

of two years. "I am reminded of 'Nero' seeing the state of governance and administration in Rajasthan. The public is doing trahimam-trahimam and Gehlot ji is playing the flute of his own thoughts," he said. Poonia said that due to infighting, neither Congress party nor the government was able to function properly. "There is a long list of failures. Crime against women has increased, law and order has completely deteriorated, contractual employees have not been regularised yet, 59 lakh farmers are waiting for complete loan waiver; un-employed youths are not being given allowance," he said.

## May god awaken the sleeping govt, says Raj

Jaipur: Hitting out at the Ashok Gehlot government on completion of two years in governance, former chief minister Vasundhara Rajee said that the government has failed in every test and its countdown has begun.

"From arrogant ministers to negligent administrations, no one has morality to understand public sentiments. May God save the public and awaken the sleeping government," she commented. Rajee said that the Congress had announced to waive the entire loan of farmers in 10 days but it has not been fulfilled till date.

She said that millet producers in the state are worried about selling their crops, but despite this, the purchase of millet has not been started.

"On the contrary, the Congress is fueling the agitation by provoking farmers. This government is invisible," she said. Raising the issue of corruption, Rajee said that Congress leaders are being vocal against their own 'invisible government'.

## Woman, wanted in abetment to suicide case, shot at

Banswara: A woman Zeenat, 30, wanted in an abetment to suicide case, was shot at her house in Indira colony on Thursday. She was admitted to a hospital in serious condition and was later referred to Udaipur. She sustained bullet injuries in her waist and chest, the police said. According to the police, the woman was involved in a trade of lending money and a man had died by suicide allegedly due to demand of money by Zeenat and her accomplice. The man's brother had lodged abetment to suicide case against Zeenat and she was avoiding the police but returned to her home from Ajmer on Thursday morning. The police are searching the accused who shot her.

## Mayor Dr Somya asked to file reply by January 7, 2021

Jaipur: A district court on Thursday issued notices to Jaipur Greater municipal corporation Mayor Dr Somya, returning officer and district election officer in a petition filed against her election on the ground of having name in voter lists at two places.

Magistrate Vyas issued the notices and sought reply by January 7.

Congress councillor Divya Singh from ward number 93, who was contesting for the post of Mayor against Dr Somya, had filed the petition. Earlier, a similar petition was filed by Pinky Yadav, who had contested the municipal corporation election against Dr Somya.

The petitioners' counsel, advocate AK Jain said Dr Somya was a registered voter in the village Devri in Karauli when she filed nomination papers for JMC elections. She also got her name included in the voters list in Jaipur but the name in Karauli's voter list was dropped on 3 November.

Jain, while referring to rules, said that a person can contest municipal corporation election only when he/she is a registered voter in the area of that mun corporation. Petitions also claimed that Dr Somya concealed in nomination papers about FIR against her filed in 2016 under various sections in Gangapur city police station of Sawaimadhopur district.

## SEC holds meeting to review local polls

## Major hurdle in Jhotwara elevated road cleared

Construction of 2.2 km long three-lane ROB-cum-elevated road started in June 2018 & was scheduled to be completed in Dec this year

Jaipur: A major hurdle in the construction of Jhotwara elevated road has been cleared after the shopkeepers gave written consent to shift the shops to alternate places. The project, which was started by the former BJP government, has already been delayed due to several issues and the shops located on both the sides



of the road were a major issue. Construction of the 2.2 km long three-lane ROB cum elevated road with a projected cost of Rs 108 crore was started in June 2018 which was

scheduled to be completed in December this year. For completing the project, 604 constructions, mostly shops, on both sides of the road have to be removed. JDA has identified land in Nirwaru Road and Hathoj Kardhani extension scheme to shift these shops but the matter was lingering on due to non seriousness of revenue officials and now after

the efforts of JDC Gaurav Goyal, the shopkeepers have agreed to shift the shops and have given the written consent. The shops will be removed within one month. The completion of the construction work has completed, it is expected that the project will be completed by December next year. After elevated road is built, traffic will be eased.
